

Elements Of A Story

Main Character

A character that interacts with the main character, but is not the main focus of the story. (Also called the antagonist).

Secondary Character

When a future event or scene is inserted into a story before it actually occurs.

Suspense

To return to an event or scene in a story that has already taken place.

Flashback

The rest of the story centers around this character.

(Also called the protagonist).

Flash Forward

Used to capture the attention of the audience, it is the growing interest and excitement felt while awaiting a climax or resolution.
